A **Governmental Affairs Ambassador Program** (GAAP) training was held for the Unity Club at The Arc/Morris to provide information about our government and how to get involved.


Council 3 put the "fun" in "fundraiser" by holding a **Bowl-A-Thon** to raise money for their NJSAAN budget.



Montclair State University Panel

On April 4th, advocates representing **Council 1** of the New Jersey Statewide Self-Advocacy Network participated in the **annual self-advocacy speakers panel at Montclair State University**. A panel of 6 advocates and 3 Direct Support Professionals spoke to a graduate class of special education students about topics such as employment, residential supports, and techniques for teaching young students about self-advocacy.

On April 5th, a **GAAP training** was held at The Arc/Morris for local selfadvocacy group, **Unity Club**.


