BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

8 Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, shall 1. a. establish a Career and Community Studies program. The program 9 shall be a liberal studies program for ¹[intellectually disabled]¹ 10 students ¹with intellectual disabilities¹ from ages 18 to 25. The 11 purpose of the program shall be to prepare ¹[intellectually 12 disabled]¹ students ¹ with intellectual disabilities¹ for adult life 13 using a post-secondary experience on a college campus. The 14 15 program shall provide the students with a combination of academic 16 rigor, career discovery and preparation, and peer socialization, as part of a diverse community of learners, and shall provide for the 17 18 award of a Career and Community Studies Program Certificate 19 upon completion of the program.

b. The university shall develop an application process and an
outreach program that encourages students, who have received
special education services while enrolled in a public or nonpublic
secondary school and who may have difficulty succeeding in a
traditional college degree program, to apply for the program.

c. The university shall consult with The College of New Jersey
in the development of the program curriculum leading to a Career
and Community Studies Program Certificate.

28 d. The university shall provide on-campus housing
29 opportunities for students in the Career and Community Studies
30 Program.

e. The university shall apply for grant funds from federal,corporate, and other entities to support the program.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of N.J.S.18A:71B-18 et seq. to the contrary, a student attending the Career and Community Studies Program established pursuant to section 1 of P.L. ,c. () (pending before the Legislature as this bill), or a similar program as determined by the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority, shall be eligible to receive a State tuition aid grant if the student meets the eligibility requirements for a State tuition aid grant.

(C. 3 shall include an overview of the program, funding sources and expenditures, student enrollment data, recommendations for 4 5 improving the program, and recommendations for the establishment 6 of a similar program at other State colleges and universities. 7 4.
