#### **Workshop at Matheny**

On August 21st, **Michael Pearson**, Training and Technical Assistance Coordinator of NJSAP, visited **Matheny Medical and Educational Center** high school classes.

He shared strategies and tips for being a **strong advocate**. Students all shared their extended school year projects for self- advocacy with him.



Healthy Relationships Workshop Series Michael also visited The Arc of Ocean to present "The Survival Guide to Healthy Relationships," a free workshop that focuses on the different types of relationships that people will experience in their lives.



This workshop examines the **common characteristics** of relationships, as well as how our **behavior and communication style** differs in each scenario. It also provides information on **boundaries**, **personal space**, **and appropriate greetings** in different types of social settings. Important tips about electronic communication and social media are provided to promote **safety** in online relationships.

The Arc of the United States put out a call for self-advocates to engage with members of Congress during the August recess. The goal of this initiative was to remind Congressional representatives about the importance of Medicaid and the daily impact of this program in the lives of people with disabilities and their family members. Donning shirts and buttons from The Arc of the US, members of the New Jersey Statewide Self-Advocacy Network's Advisory Board posed for a snapshot in front of the North Brunswick Municipal Building. The following day, a group of self-advocates representing The Arc of Atlantic County also donned the shirts and buttons during a meeting with Congressman LoBiondo where they discussed the need to protect and preserve funding for critical programs like Medicaid and SSI.
