#### We've been busy this May!

During the first weekend of this month, the NJSAP team attended the **Abilities Expo**. The team worked to bring important resources and information to the community of advocates, family members, caregivers, seniors, and healthcare professionals who attended the event.

Members of the New Jersey Statewide Self-Advocacy Network testified at the **Senate and Assembly Budget Committee hearings** on **May 1st** and **May 11th.** Advocates showed up in a big way to support the Coalition for a DSP Living Wage's campaign to increase wages for New Jersey's Direct Support Professionals in the FY18 Budget.

A gift card and certificate was presented to students at **Sparta High School** for placing third in our **Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month** poster contest in March.

We hosted an **Advisor and Officer Workshop** on May 19th at The Arc of Ocean. The workshop highlighted the roles and responsibilities of all self-advocacy group officers and advisors. The group engaged in a discussion about advocating on issues of importance and making positive change together.

### WATCHUNG WEDNESDAYS




Watchung Wednesdays continued on through May! This special piece of the Healthy Lifestyles Project
