The SABE Conference took place on June 7 - 9 in Birmingham, AL and brought advocates from all over the country to band together and proclaim that disability rights are civil rights.

#### **SABE Conference**

The theme this year was "Let's Make it Happen: Disability Rights are Civil Rights", accompanied by an image of Lady Liberty. The National Self-advocacy Conference is a great place for people to learn, grow and advocate with their peers and allies who truly support civil rights.

The event included people from all over the country, with groups of advocates parading flags from their home state. There were also many musical guests and speakers who came together to promote civil rights for self-advocates.

Please include necessary funding in FY2019 to raise DSP wages by \$1.25 p/h.




















Free group trail walks for adults with developmental disabilities led by the New Jersey Self-Advocacy project team!


