NEW REGULATIONS REQUIRE MEDICAID

- DDD ELIGIBILITY
 - Functional Test
 - Limitation in 3 of 7 areas of major life activity
- 18 Years old
- DDD SERVICES
 - At least 21 years old
 - Have Medicaid
- DDD says Medicaid = Services

OPTIONS FOR OBTAINING MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY

- SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME ("SSI")
- COMMUNITY MEDICIAD
- WORKABILITY
- DISABLED ADULT CHILD ("DAC")

SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME

- INDIVIDUAL WITH A DISABILITY
 - UNABLE TO ENGAGE IN SUBSTANTIAL GAINFUL ACTIVITY ("SGA")
 - SGA = \$1,040/MONTH
- INCOME LIMIT = \$741.25/MONTH
- ASSET LIMIT = \$2,000
- SSI Eligibility = Medicaid

COMMUNITY MEDICAID

- Individual with a disability
- Income limit = \$958/month
- Asset limit = \$4,000



• Apply with the County Board of Social Services

WORKABILITY

- Individual with a disability between the ages of 16 and 64
- Working full or part time
- Earning no more than \$58,236 per year
- Unearned income of no more than \$958 per month

WORKABILITY (continued)

- Less than \$20,000 in liquid assets
- Liquid assets do not include
- Social Security Disability Benefits on the individual's work history
- The individual's Railroad Retirement System Benefits
- Qualified Retirement Accounts
- Value of a home
- Value of a car

DISABLED ADULT CHILD ("DAC") CRITERIA

- Individual with a disability at least 18 years old
- Disability manifest before age 22
- Individual received SSI



- Individual lost SSI because starts receiving Social Security benefits on the work history of a parent.
- Asset limit \$2,000

CAN EVERYONE BE ELIGILBE FOR MEDICAID? \hookrightarrow

- No, there are a number of individuals who may not be able to obtain Medicaid benefits.
 - Individuals who received Social Security benefits prior to age 18 on a parent's work history
 - Individuals who collect Social Security Disability benefits on their own work history and are not presently working
- What happens if you are not Medicaid Eligible?

WHAT IF THE INDIVIDUAL HAS ASSETS?

- "Spend Down"
 - Fair Market Value
 - Rent/room and board
 - Extra therapies
 - Trips
 - Personal items
 - Not simply giving away assets
 - Not difficult, but be careful
 - May need advice

PROVISION OF SERVICES UNDER THE COMPREHENSIVE WAIVER • The Comprehensive Waiver is Medicaid

- DDD Supports Program
 - Is part of the Comprehensive Waiver
- The Supports Program provides
 - Employment or day services
 - Budget based on level of need



- The Community Care Waiver ("CCW") is MEDICAID
- REQUIRED FOR RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

 - The CCW provides Residential Services Day Services

 - For individuals receiving residential
