



# Who can vote?

If you want to vote in a US election, you must be:

Registered to vote

• 17 years old to register, at least 18 years old to vote

US citizen

# Voting exclusions



People who are currently incarcerated are **not permitted** to vote in New Jersey

In NJ, voting rights are automatically restored upon release from prison

In March 2020, NJ law changed to restore voting rights to more than **80,000 residents** who are on probation or parole

# How do I register to vote?

If you want to vote on Election Day, you must complete a voter registration application.

Becoming a registered voter is free.

Due to COVID-19, it is not possible to register to vote in person.



You must **mail** a completed voter registration application to the <u>County Commissioner of</u>
Registration or <u>Superintendent of Elections for your county</u>.

The registration deadline to vote in the next election is **21 days before** the election day.

- You are NOT currently serving a sentence, probation or parole because of a felony conviction

#### Registration Deadline: 21 days before an election

### Vote By Mail Ballot

You must be a registered voter in order to apply for a Vote By Mail Ballot.

Vote by mail ballots used to be called Absentee Ballots.

You don't need any special reason to vote by mail instead of at your polling place on Election Day.

# Voting By Mail

I. Complete your Vote By Mail application and return it to your County Clerk's Office.

You can mail the application to the Clerk up to one week (7 days) before the election.

You can also return the completed application to the County Clerk up until 3 o'clock on the day before the election\*




2. After reviewing your Vote By Mail application, the County Clerk will mail a Vote By Mail Ballot to your residence.

You must follow the directions on the ballot very carefully. Ask for help if you have questions.

**3.** You must return your completed ballot to the Office of the Board of Elections in your county BEFORE the polls close at 8PM on Election Day.

Remember: You can only vote once per election.

If you have already requested a Vote By Mail ballot, you cannot also vote in person at your polling place.



## Preparing to Vote

At least 1 week before an election, you will receive a sample ballot in the mail.

This sample ballot will list the candidates in the election and the ballot questions you can vote on.



The sample ballot also tells you where you can vote (the polling place) on Election Day.

#### Remember:

You can vote in person on Election Day or by mail!

### More about voter registration...

 You must register to vote at least 21 days before an election, after living in the same county for 30 days.

You only have to register to vote once, unless you move to a different county or state. You do NOT

have to register again before every election.



If you move within the same county, you must fill out another voter registration application to change your address.



# Types of Elections

#### **The General Election**

When you vote for Federal and State Administration, including the President of the US, Governor of New Jersey, Senators, Congresspeople and county officials.

2020 GENERAL

TUESDAY,

You can register as a Democrat or Republican when you register to vote.

#### **The Primary Election**

This election allows registered members of the Republic and Democratic political parties to chose who will run as their candidate in the General Election.

#### **2020 Primary Election:**

Tuesday, July 7th


### COVID-19 and Voting

# N.J.'s July 7 primary election will be mostly vote-by-mail during coronavirus pandemic, Murphy says

Updated May 15, 2020; Posted May 15, 2020

- All registered Democratic and Republican voters will receive a mail-in ballot with prepaid postage to vote in the July 7, 2020 primary election
- Unaffiliated or inactive voters will get an application to apply for mail-in ballots
- Voters can drop off ballots at regular mail boxes and secure drop-boxes that counties will be required to set up
- Governor Murphy during COVID-19 briefing on May 15, 2020: "We will ensure every vote is counted...our goals are twofold: to maximize our democracy while minimizing the risk of illness. We want everyone to participate in a safe and fully democratic process."

# 2020 Primary Elections



During his daily COVID-19 briefing on May 15th, Governor Murphy acknowledged that many people prefer to vote in person, and that people with disabilities may have difficulty filling out a vote-by-mail ballot.

The state will require at least one polling location to be opened in all 565 municipalities in New Jersey, with social-distancing protocols, including the sanitizing of touch-screen voting machines.

Voters in the primary will cast ballots for the major-party nominations for president, Cory Booker's U.S. Senate seat, and all 12 of the state's seats in the U.S. House of Representatives

# Voting at Your Polling Place

Every town or municipality has a **polling place** where all registered voters can cast their ballots in person.

Polling places might be at schools, churches or libraries in your community.

You must vote at your assigned polling place if you want to vote in person\*

\*Due to public health and safety concerns related to COVID-19, voters in the July 7th primary are strongly encouraged to vote by mail.







# Polling Places and Voting In Person

New Jersey's polling places are open from 6 AM until 8 PM, giving you many hours to cast your ballot in person\* on Election Day.

# Voting and Accessibility




One accessible polling machine adapted for **audio** must be available at every polling place to allow voters who have visual impairment to verify and cast their votes in private and without assistance.

Polling places should be **integrated** settings, meaning that all people (with and without disabilities) should vote together in the same space.

People with disabilities have the right to reasonable accommodations that make it possible to vote

People with disabilities also have the right to use auxiliary aids to ensure that **communication is effective** 

Auxiliary aides include things like: Assisted Listening equipment, registration forms in Braille and large print, ramps to access the polling area



# Keep In Mind...



- \* People have the **right** to vote even if they have an intellectual or developmental disability.
  - \* People have the **right** to make their own choices about how they want to vote and who they want to vote for.
- \* You have the **right** to discuss your opinion or not discuss your opinion with anyone.
- \* You do not have to tell anyone who you voted for, unless you **choose** to.

#### Sample Ballots in Polling Places

Sample ballots will be available at the polling place on the day of the election.

The sample ballot shall be as nearly as possible a facsimile of the official ballot and shall have printed on it:

- The number of the election district
- The location of the polling place
- The hours of the election
- The date of the election
- An indication of whether the polling place is accessible to voters with disabilities. If non-accessible, the sample ballot must indicate the availability of Vote by Mail ballots
- Information on how the voter can obtain or view the Voter's Bill of Rights

#### Voting Machine

#### You Can Vote on the Voting Machine if:

- Your complete voter registration information is in the poll book;
- You currently live in the election district or moved out of the County after the close of registration for this election (thereafter you must be registered in your new County); and
- There are no successful challenges to your right to vote.

#### You Have the Right to

- Vote in private on the voting machine;
- Bring voting materials (such as the sample ballot, but no campaign material) into the voting booth to help you vote;
- A "reasonable" amount of time to cast your vote.

Instructions on use of the voting machine are available in the polling place. If you do not see them, ask any board worker.

#### Assistance on the Voting Machine

- If you are blind, disabled or cannot read the ballot on the machine, you can have someone of your choice assist you with the voting machine. You can not have the assistance of a representative of your employer or union.
- If you are alone and are entitled to assistance, two board workers of opposite political parties may help you. You have the right to have both workers assist you or one worker - It is your choice.
- The district board workers must first fill out a disability certificate for you before you can use the voting machine.

Standing in Line to Vote: If you are in line to vote after the polls have closed. You MUST be allowed to vote. Board workers CANNOT turn you away.

Emergency Ballots: If the voting machine is not working, DO NOT LEAVE the Polling Place. A board worker will give you a Paper Emergency Ballot. If you spoil your ballot, you have the right to ask the board worker for another ballot.

#### First-Time Voter

#### **ID** Requirements

#### Certain "Need ID" Voters

The following voters have to show ID at the polling place:

- If you registered to vote by mail in this County after January 1, 2003, and never voted in a federal election in the County, you were required to provide identification. If you did not provide identification before voting for the first time at the polling place, you must show the board workers identification today; or
- You did not complete section 5 of the New Jersey voter registration form (section 5 requires a Driver's License #, last 4 digits of the social security number if you have no driver's license, or an affirmation you do not have either set of numbers), and you did not respond to a request for such information, you must show the board workers identification today; or
- You were a mail-in registrant and did provide your driver's license number or the last four digits of your social security number, but the numbers could not be verified, you must show the board workers identification today.

If you DO NOT show the board workers any identification you CANNOT vote on the voting machine. You MUST vote with a provisional paper ballot.

An identifying document may include, but is not limited to:

- Any Valid and Current Photo ID:
  - O NJ driver's license
  - O Military or other Government ID
  - O Student or Job ID
  - O Store Membership Card, or,

Any current document with your name and address on it, including but is not limited to:

- Bank statement
- Car registration
- Sample ballot
- Utility bill
- Pay check
- Rent receipt
- Government check or document
- Non-photo NJ driver's license

#### Vote By Mail

The Vote by Mail application must go to your County Clerk's Office. If you mail it to your County Clerk, it needs to get there at least 7 days before the election. After that day, you must deliver the application to the County Clerk's Office in person. Ballots can be issued by the Clerk until 3:00 p.m. of the day before the election.

Now, you can ask for a vote by mail ballot for all future elections until you request otherwise in writing. Also, any voter who wishes to vote by mail in any single election can request to receive a ballot for that election.

#### Authorized Messenger Process

Any voter may ask someone to be their Authorized Messenger to go to the County Clerk's office to get the ballot.

At the bottom of the application, you must write the name of the person

#### Vote By Mail Continued

#### Bearer Process

Any voter may ask someone to be their Bearer to return the ballot to the appropriate Board of Election office.

- On the return envelope of your ballot, the bearer must sign the certification stating that he or she received the ballot directly from the voter and no other person and is authorized to deliver the ballot to the appropriate Board of Election office.
- No one can be a Bearer without your permission.
- No person can be a Bearer for more than three qualified voters in an election.
- No candidate in the election for which you are requesting a vote by mail ballot can be a Bearer.

#### Provisional Ballot Voting

#### You MUST Vote by Provisional Ballot if:

- You are a registered voter in the County who moved within the County and did not notify the County Commissioner of Registration before election day of your current address; or
- Your registration information is not complete in the poll book, for example your signature or address is missing; or
- You are an "Active need ID" or "Inactive need ID" voter who has not provided identification information (see above section); or
- There is a marking in the poll book that you applied for a Vote by Mail ballot, but you tell the board worker, you did not apply for a Vote by Mail ballot, you applied for a Vote by Mail ballot, but did not receive the ballot or you received a Vote by Mail ballot but did not return it.

\*For the provisional ballot to count, a copy of your ID must be submitted to your County Commissioner of Registration by close of business on the second day after the election.

#### How to Vote by Provisional Ballot:

- The board worker will give you a paper ballot and an envelope.
- The board worker must provide you with a place to vote the ballot in secret.
- Put the voted ballot in the envelope and seal it.
- Sign and complete the "Affirmation Statement" that is attached to the envelope. DO NOT DETACH the Affirmation Statement. \*If you do not sign the Affirmation Statement, your ballot will not be counted.
- Give the envelope to the board worker.
- Watch the board worker put the envelope into the provisional ballot bag, or you may put your ballot into the bag yourself.
- If you spoil your ballot, you have the right to ask the boardworker for another ballot.

No provisional ballot is counted at the polling place. All provisional ballots are taken to the County Commissioner of Registration's office after the close of the polls for verification and counting by the County Board of Election.

After the election, you can call 1-877-NJ-VOTER (1-877-658-6837) to find out if your ballot was counted. If your ballot was not counted, you can find out why it was rejected.

#### Election Offenses

- Electioneering It is a crime under State law to electioneer within 100 feet of the outside entrance of the polling place up to and including the polling room. There can be no campaign signs or material in this area and no one can campaign on behalf of any candidate or public question.
- Fraudulent Voting It is a crime under federal and State law to attempt to vote or vote knowing you are not entitled to vote, or to provide false information when registering to vote or voting. You are not permitted to vote more than once in an election.
- Conspiracy It is a federal crime to conspire to deprive voters of a fair election. If anyone is harassing you or improperly interfering with your right to vote, ask a board worker for assistance.

#### Challenger Do's & Don'ts

#### Challengers Can:

- Beginning at 8 a.m., and no more than every two hours thereafter, ask the district board for the official count of how many voters have voted, and the district board shall, beginning at 8 a.m., and no more than every two hours thereafter, display a notice containing the official count of the total number of voters who have voted.
- Challenge a voter if the challenger believes the voter is not qualified to vote.
   In order to vote a person must be:
  - A United States citize
  - O Registered to vote
  - O 18 years of age or older
  - O A resident of the County for at least 30 days before the election

#### Challengers Cannot:

- Challenge a voter for any of these reasons:
  - O They think they know how the voter is going to vote.
  - O The race or ethnic origin of the voter.
  - O The voter resides in a particular ward, housing complex, or section of a municipality or county.

#### IT IS A CRIMINAL OFFENSE FOR A CHALLENGER TO CHALLENGE A VOTER FOR ANY OF THE ABOVE 3 REASONS.

- Sit with the district board workers or touch the election materials.
- Go to the voting machine during the voting hours.
- Challenge the voter directly. Only the district board can ask the voter questions.
- Wear any campaign buttons, signs or campaign clothing.
- Harass or intimidate any voters; or cause any disturbances in the polling place.
- Challenge a voter because the district board asks the voter to affirm his or her residence, or asks a first-time registrant by mail to show identification.

## Challenge Process in the Polling Place

 If your right to vote is challenged, the board workers may ask you for identification and you must sign an affidavit. The challenger must also sign an affidavit.


