
Let's take a closer look!

The event included people from all over the country, with groups of advocates parading flags from their home state. There were also many musical guests and speakers who came together to promote civil rights for self-advocates.






Advocacy Day

Many dressed in the Coalition's colors of blue and green, representatives flooded the State House and spoke to Senators and Assembly members about the critical importance of this issue.

HLP: Watchung Wednesdays


There were three different hikes this month at the Watchung Reservation as part of our Healthy Lifestyles Project: Watchung Wednesdays!


