In February, I/DD Legislation Passes Assembly & Self-Advocates Meet with DHS Commissioner

The Arc of New Jersey is happy to report that the full Assembly recently passed two pieces of legislation supported by our organization. This includes, A4482 which establishes a "Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Violence Against Persons with Developmental Disabilities" and A4547 which requires collection and reporting of information concerning crimes against the elderly and



people with disabilities. These bills will now head to the Senate where they will need to be voted on in Committee and then by the full body before they can move to the Governor's Desk for his signature or veto. To continue reading, <u>click here</u>.

Lunch & Learn Webinar Safety Series: Supporting the Village: Helping Parents and Caregivers to Support Youths' Healthy Sexual Development, a 3-part series

Tuesday, March 12 at 12 pm

Part 2 - 7th-12th grade

As parents and caregivers, we worry about the health and wellbeing of our children. When we look through the lens of intellectual or developmental disabilities (I/DD), sometimes we get even more worried about lots of different things, like sex and sexuality. It can be difficult to know how or when to talk to children with I/DD about sex,



particularly because we are afraid that they may be victimized. This 3-part webinar series is designed to increase parents' and caregivers' comfort in talking about sex and sexuality with their children. We will discuss the social, physiological, and emotional changes that happen before, during, and after puberty. We will provide tools and skills for parents and caregivers to support the development, independence, and success of their children.

College Tour: College Steps Program at Community College of Morris Friday, March 22 at 11 am

Calling all students with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. Join The Arc of New Jersey Family Institute for a tour of the College Steps program at the Community College of Morris. The mission of College Steps is to provide supplemental support for students living with social, communication and learning disabilities. The primary goal of College Steps is to support the unique needs of students while preparing them for meaningful careers and increased autonomy after college. College Steps students are supported with a framework of supports in four core content areas: Academic Enrichment, Social Integration, Living and Independence, and Pre-Employment Skills. College Steps supports high school transition students, age 16-21 years and college students ages 18-26.

Webinar: New Jersey Department of Human Services Bureau of Guardianship Services: An Overview of Guardianship

Wednesday, March 27 at 1 pm

At age 18, all individuals, including those with developmental disabilities, reach the legal age of majority. This means that parents can no longer make decisions legally on behalf of an adult child, regardless of the nature of the individual's disability and regardless of whether or not the individual still lives with the family. Some families may want to consider guardianship as an option for their family member. Join us as the New Jersey Bureau of Guardianship Services (BGS) discuss guardianship options, the process of obtaining guardianship and ways BGS can help.

College Tour: Raritan Valley Community College Tour Friday, March 29 at 10 am

Calling all students with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. Join The Arc of New Jersey Family Institute for a tour of The Achievement Center at Raritan Valley Community College (RVCC); a partnership program of The Arc of Somerset and Hunterdon Counties and RVCC. You will have an opportunity to visit the campus and learn about the different aspects of a college experience. The Achievement Center is student centered, with a recommendation of core skills classes important to future success. Students and families will learn about the curriculum, support methods and individualization for each student's needs and goals. Areas of study include: Academic, Personal and Career Development, Campus and Civic Engagement and Social Skill Building.

Transition Conference: Free Parent Forum & Opportunity Expo (Central Jersey) Saturday, March 30 at 9 am

This expo will start with an opening session on why planning is critical and how to start a plan for your child with I/DD. The second session will explain SSI and Medicaid and why you need to apply. Attendees will then have a break to visit with our service providers who will have information tables set up. For the last session of the day, participants can choose one of three workshops focusing on different areas of interest.
