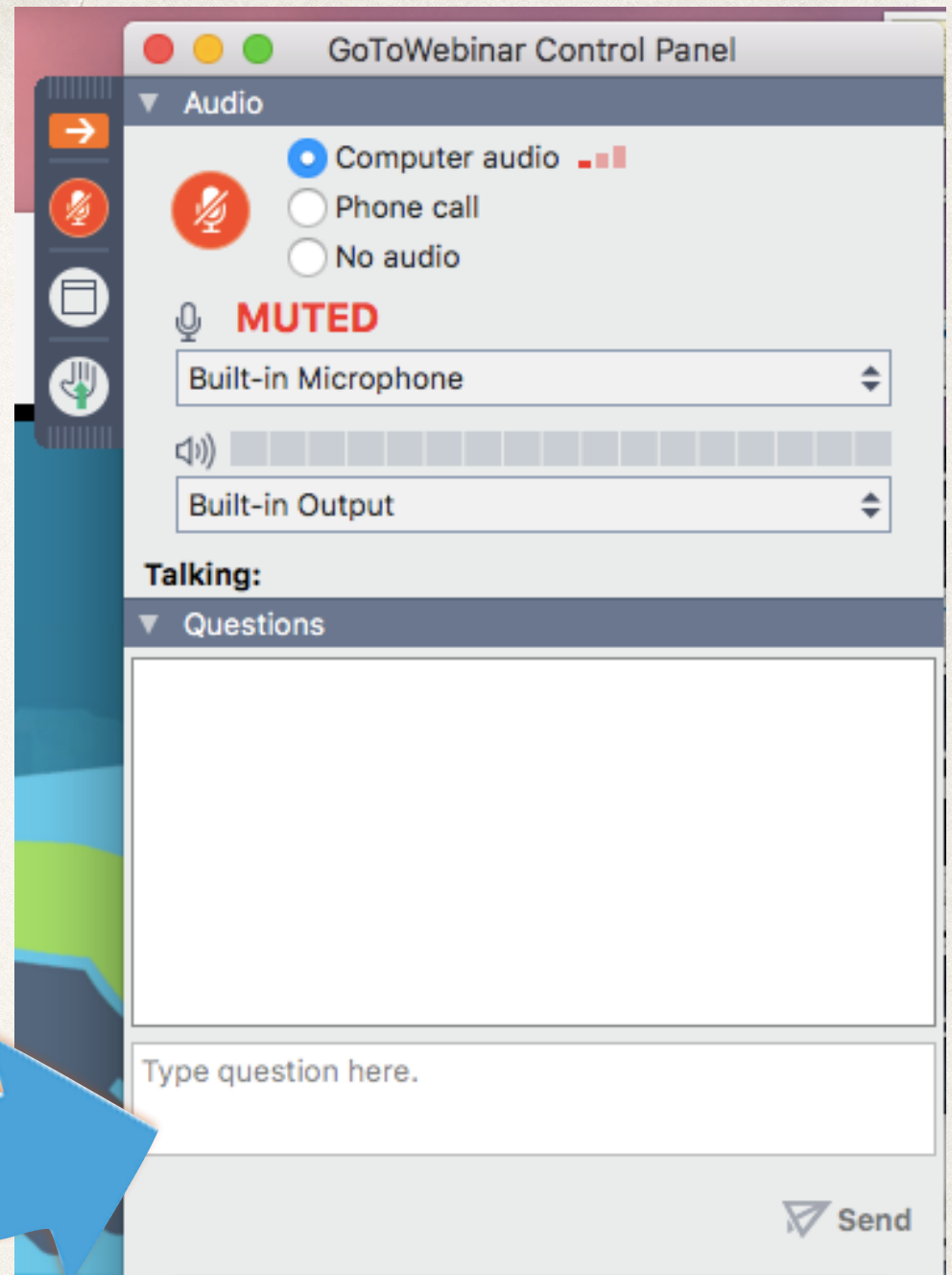

Census 2020: What is it?

- ❖ A census is a type of nationwide **survey**
- ❖ A census happens **every 10 years**
- ❖ The **goal** of a census is to:
 - ❖ Count every resident living in the United States once, only once and in the right place

Who conducts the 2020 Census?

- ❖ The [U.S. Census Bureau](#), which is the largest **statistical** agency in the U.S.
- ❖ The census is mandated by Article 1, Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution
- ❖ Increasingly **diverse** and **growing population**: 330 million people in more than 140 million households!

Why is the census important?

- Results of the census determine the number of seats each state has in the **U.S. House of Representatives**
- **Determines the annual allocation of \$675 billion dollars in federal funding**
 - **Over \$22B in federal funding is directed to NJ each year, including funding for Medicaid, SNAP, Highway & Road Planning, Section 8 Housing, Special Education Grants, S-CHIP, Title I Grants, National School Lunch Program, WIC, Head Start, Foster Care, Health Center Programs**
- Defines congressional and state **legislative districts, school districts** and **voting precincts**
- Informs **planning** for governments, business and community groups
- Provides population benchmarks for nearly every other [United States survey](#)

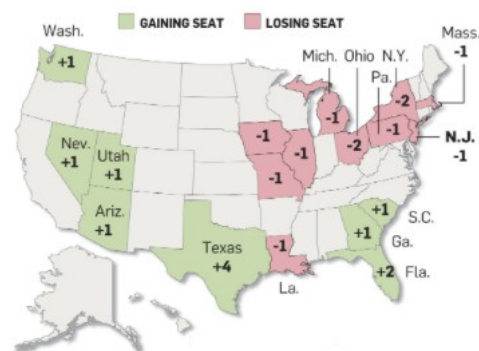

States likely to gain or lose seats in the House of Representatives, based on population shifts shown in new data from the 2010 Census.

The Census numbers are in, and it's official: New Jersey will lose a seat in the House of Representatives, shrinking its congressional delegation from 13 to 12.

Although New Jersey's population grew 4.5 percent, to 8,791,894 over the last 10 years, it was not enough to keep pace with the population boom in the south and west, according to figures released today by the U.S. Census Bureau.

“What’s certain is that New Jersey will have one less vote on critical pieces of legislation, and one less electoral vote in presidential elections.”

Is the census safe?

❖ **YES! Your responses are private and confidential.**



❖ Your private information including names, addresses (including GPS coordinates), Social Security Numbers, and telephone numbers, is never published!

❖ **Personal information collected by the Census Bureau cannot be used against respondents by any government agency or court.**

❖ Census Bureau employees are sworn to protect confidentiality for life and your responses are protected under federal law.

❖ Responses are only used to produce statistics/data.



I live in a group home. How should I complete the census?

- ❖ Residents of group homes, supervised apartments, and other group living arrangements should participate in the census!
- ❖ Be counted at the **right place**, which is where you sleep most nights of the year.
- ❖ Staff, family members, or friends can **assist you** in filling out the census or you can request an in-person or phone interview with a census worker.



I live in a rental property. Do I still have to fill out the census?

Yes.

Everyone counts, regardless of whether or not you own your home or live in a rental property, mobile home park, or condominium complex.



What kind of information is collected by the census?

- ❖ Your name,
- ❖ age,
- ❖ date of birth,
- ❖ race and origin,
- ❖ ~~citizenship,~~
- ❖ relationship,
- ❖ gender...



Does the 2020 Census ask about citizenship?

No, there is **no citizenship question** on the 2020 Census.

The 2020 Census **does not ask** whether you or anyone in your home is a U.S. citizen.

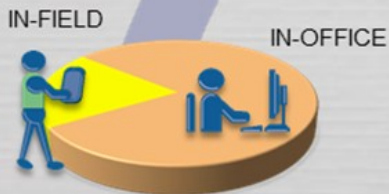

- Conduct a 100% review and update of the nation's address list
- Minimize field work with in-office updating
- Use multiple data sources to identify areas with address changes
- Get local government input

Collect data from all households, including group and unique living arrangements

- Make it easy for people to respond anytime, anywhere
- Encourage people to use the new online response option

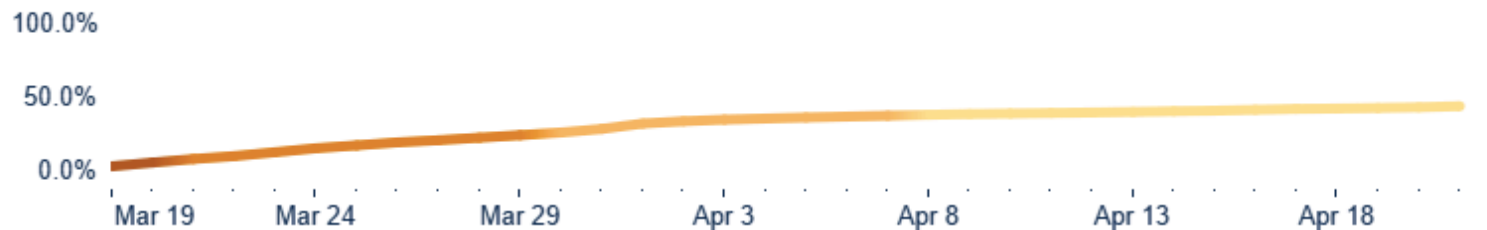

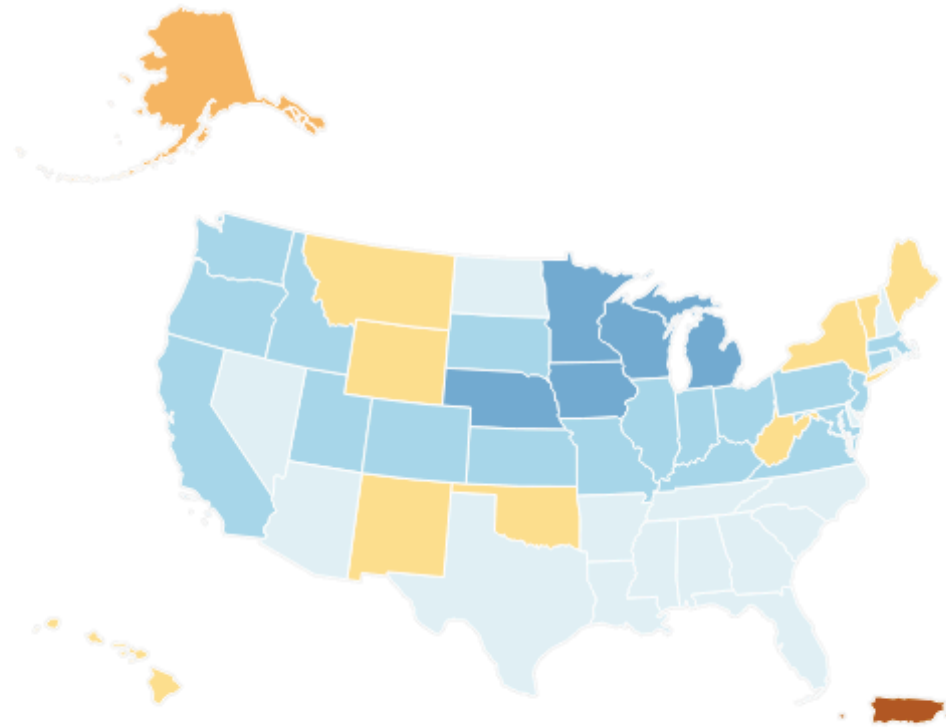

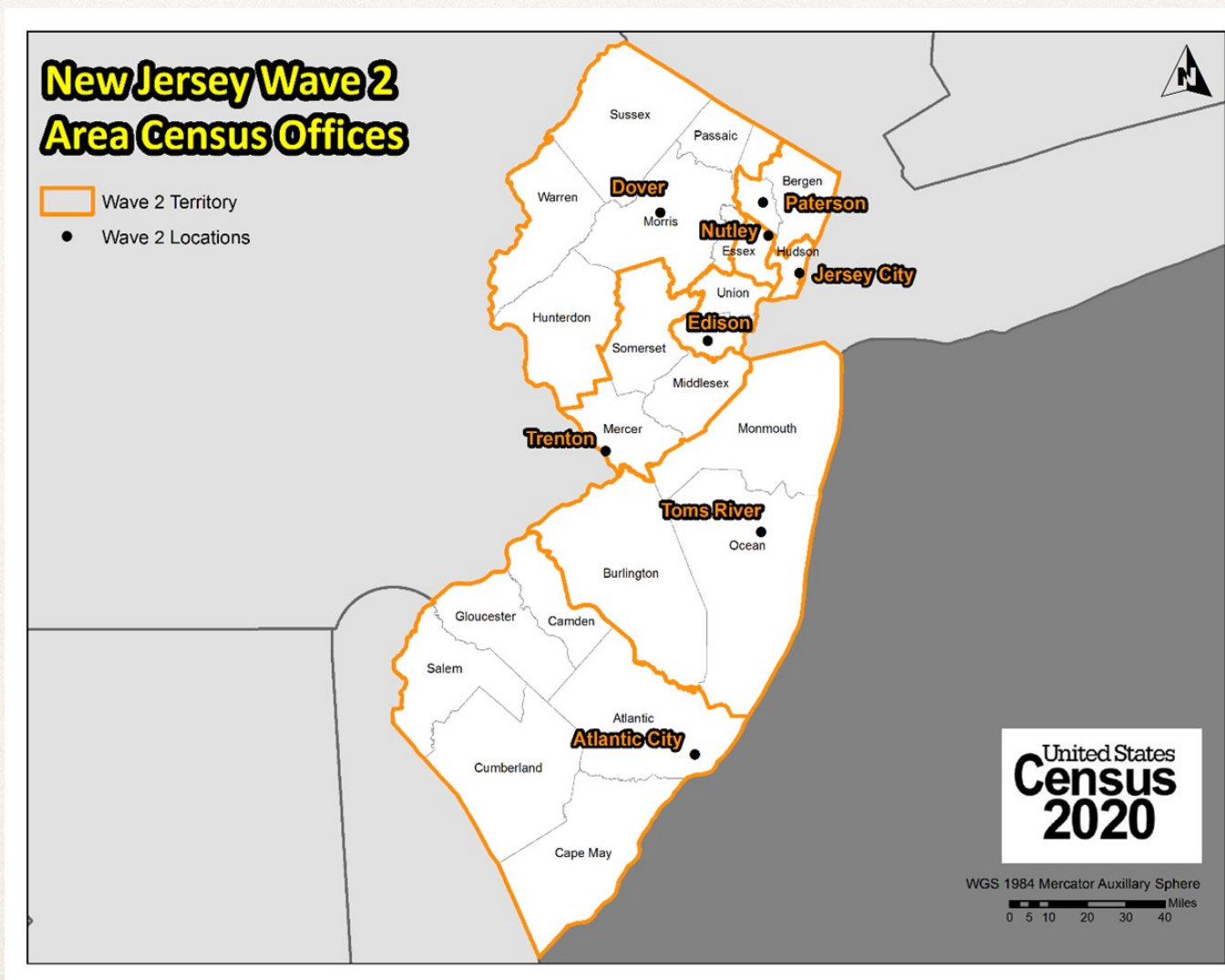


Minnesota Total Self-Response Rate

❖ By mail

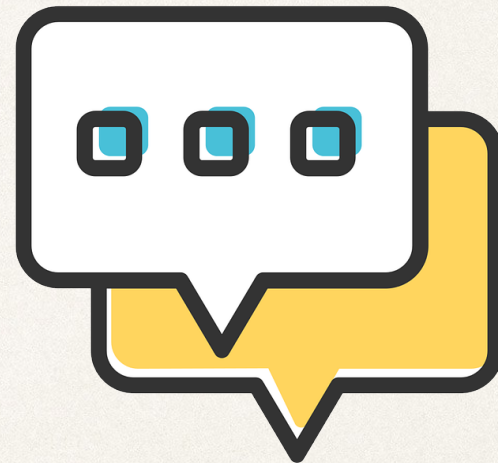


❖ By phone

❖ **The census is available in 13 languages**

Requesting phone call or in-person interview to complete census

- ❖ Your first invite should have arrived during the week of March 12th, 2020
- ❖ Toll free number on invite; you can call to complete in 1 of 12 languages over the phone
- ❖ Invite will include your census ID which acts like a pin and is unique to your household
- ❖ **Cheryl Bolden: Coordinator for State of NJ**
- ❖ E-mail: cheryl.bolden@2020census.gov
- ❖ Office phone: 212-882-2130
- ❖ Work cell: 848-256-5599
- ❖ In-person interview is *last resort*, but possible if you need extra help completing the census. **Due to COVID-19, in-person interviews and Census Bureau field work will resume after June 1, 2020.**



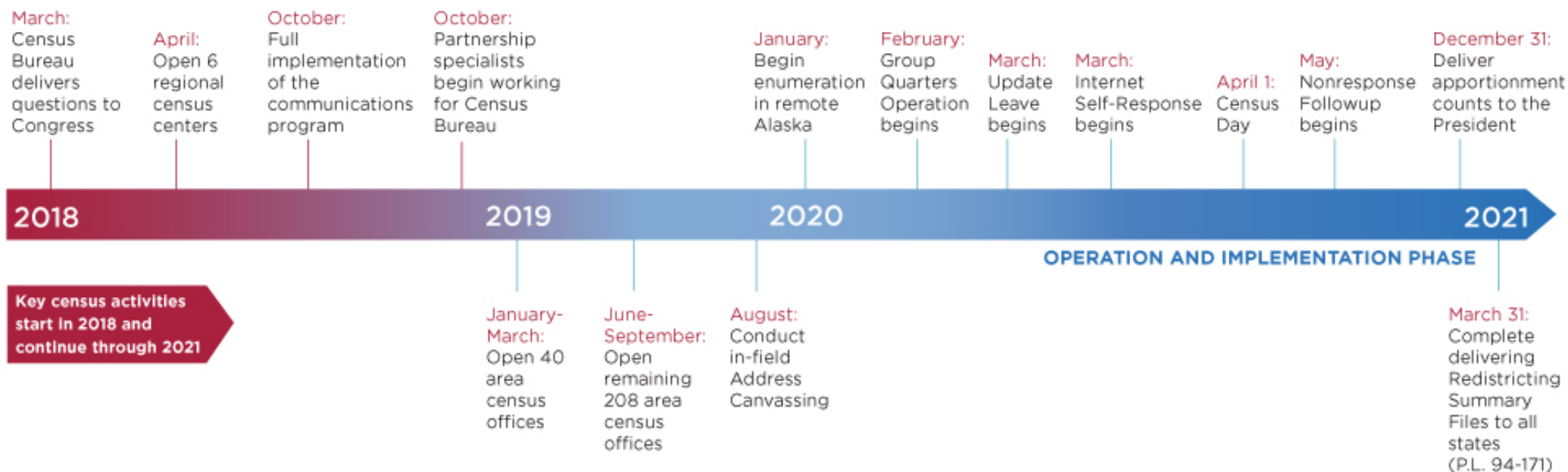

- The Census Bureau mailed or hand delivered invitations to complete the 2020 Census beginning in **March 2020**.
- Most households will receive a letter during the first mailing requesting the housing unit complete the census online, using the Internet Self-Response method (called “Internet First”).
- All non-responding housing units will receive a letter and paper form during the fourth mailing.

Road to the 2020 Census

2020 Census Operational Timeline



Census timeline adjusted due to COVID-19

March 12 - October 31, 2020: Self-response phase (internet, by mail, and phone)

April 2 - September 3: Group Quarters (large groups of people living together)

August 11 - October 31: Nonresponse follow up (census takers interview households in person)

October 31, 2020 - April 30, 2021: Review data, get rid of duplicate responses, finalize total count

April 30, 2021: The US Census Bureau will deliver **apportionment counts** to the President and Congress as required by law

Get the Facts How To Respond Why Your Answers Matter Privacy and Security

RESPOND

NO. The 2020 Census does not ask whether you or anyone in your home is a U.S. citizen.

Are non-citizens counted in the census?

YES. Everyone counts. The 2020 Census counts everyone living in the country, including non-citizens. [Learn more about who should be counted when you complete the 2020 Census.](#)

Can my answers be shared with law enforcement or used against me?

NO. The law prevents the Census Bureau from sharing your information with law enforcement. Your answers cannot be used to impact your eligibility for government benefits. Your answers are only used to create statistics about our country. The Census Bureau is bound by Title 13 of the U.S. Code to protect your personal information and keep it strictly confidential. That's every answer, to every question.

Reporting a Rumor

Have you seen or heard something about the 2020 Census that is confusing?

Let the Census Bureau know by contacting rumors@census.gov.

Then be sure to spread the word to make sure everyone has the right information about the 2020 Census.

Fact: Census workers may visit your home*

If a US Census Bureau employee visits your home to collect information **after June 1st*, they will have a badge and ID.



Check to make sure that they have a **valid ID badge**, with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date.

If you still have questions about their identity, you can call 844-330-2020 to speak with a Census Bureau representative.

Rumor: The census asks for your social security number and credit information

The 2020 Census will **never** ask for:

- Your Social Security number.
- Your bank account or credit card numbers.
- Anything on behalf of a political party.
- Money or donations.

The Census Bureau will **not** contact you on behalf of a political party.

Be aware of “**phishing**” emails directing you to phony websites

All valid Census Bureau websites will always end in **.gov**



Fact: Census workers will have valid ID

What can I do now?



- ❖ **Complete** the census by mail, internet, or phone!
- ❖ Do additional **research**: <https://www.census.gov>
- ❖ **Encourage** others to complete the 2020 census
- ❖ Spread **accurate information** about the census and check rumors

Remember: Completing the 2020 Census is your responsibility.
