

JOIN OUR COMMUNITY-BASED PARTICIPATORY RESEARCH (CBPR) STUDY

BUILDING CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE PREVENTION EFFORTS IN U.S.

Through the development of a CBPR Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Coalition (CCPC), we are conducting research to examine the perspectives of adult survivors of child sexual abuse in the United States. We are looking to learn from survivor experiences to understand the social norms, attitudes, knowledge, and beliefs that contributed to risk and/or protective factors.

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

- (1) An online survey about how cultural/social expectations influenced your experiences, involvement with child welfare or juvenile justice, ways you have been harmed, and how you have coped (45 minutes).
- (2) An interview to reflect upon your experiences and perspectives about prevention efforts (if selected to participate; 1-1.5 hours).

ELIGIBILITY AND COMPENSATION

Individuals are eligible to participate if they are adults who experienced child sexual abuse in the United States.

All participants who complete a survey will be entered into a raffle drawing for 1 of 10 \$100 gift cards. Participants may be invited to complete an interview. Participants who complete an interview will receive a \$75 gift card.
