On July 26th, 1990, The ADA was signed into law and aimed to end discrimination against people with disabilities.

Current Supplemental Security Income (SSI) rules require that someone receiving SSI can only have \$2,000 in assets. Married couples can only have \$3,000. The SSI Savings Penalty Elimination Act [S.4102] raises the SSI asset limit to \$10,000 for individuals and \$20,000 for couples. The legislation also increases those numbers every year based on inflation.

Unfortunately, SSI limits prevent many people with disabilities from getting married or saving for important life events, like purchasing a home, out of fear of losing critical benefits and supports.

I am calling to ask you to support The SSI Savings Penalty Elimination Act which is a step toward income equality and financial security for people with disabilities nationwide.

Everyone should have the right to marry the person they love without losing access to critical supports.
