WHEN TO CALL POISON CONTROL

Contact with Skin or Eyes

**If you took too much
medicine or swallowed
something harmful- Call for
guidance.**

**Suspected Poisoning-
even if there are no
symptoms, call for
immediate advice.**

**Inhale Fumes- Move to
fresh air, then call.**

WHEN TO CALL POISON CONTROL CONTINUED

**Household Products- Cleaners, detergents, paint
chips.**

Plants- Eating wild mushrooms or poisonous plants.

Bites & Stings- From snakes, insects, or other animals.

Food Poisoning or contaminated food.

**Substances- Hand sanitizers, recreational drugs,
chemicals.**

WHAT TO TELL THEM

When you call, be ready with the substance name, amount, age/weight of the person, and time of exposure. Then, go over the symptoms. Also, have the product container handy.



Use the webPOISONCONTROL tool online or via app for non-serious cases.

WHEN TO CALL 911

Unconscious- The person is not waking up.

Seizures or Convulsions- The body is shaking uncontrollably.

Trouble Breathing- Gasping or struggling to get air.

Collapsed- the person has fallen down and can't get up.
