

Adolescent Housing Hub



What is it?



The Adolescent Housing Hub (AHH) is a database to assist youth with placement in a transitional or permanent housing program.



AHH services are available to eligible homeless youth, youth at risk for homelessness, and youth aging out of the child welfare system, ages 18 – 21 years.

Supervised Transitional Living Program



Provides supervised housing and other supports to 18–21 year olds. Young people can stay for 18–24 months. They help with living skills, employment, education and finding long term housing.

Transitional Living Program

Provides semi-supervised housing and other supports to 18–21 year olds. The time young people can stay vary. They help with living skills, employment, education, and finding long term housing.

Permanent Supportive Housing

Provides housing with voluntary services for 18–21 year olds. There are no limits on how long they can stay. Youth in these programs have a lease or sublet and pay some portion of their income toward rent (less than 30%).
