## Protection of Pupil Rights Ammendment (PPRA)

This applies to state and local education agencies or anyone receiving money from the U.S. Department of Education. It sets rules

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for giving students surveys, analyses, or evaluations that cover any of eight protected area.



PPRA also covers student privacy, marketing surveys, parent access to information, and some physical exams for minors. When a student turns 18 or is legally independent, these rights shift from the parents to the student.
