

Common Accommodations for Physical/Orthopedic Impairment

Allow the student to have
extended time to finish
assignments

Provide the student with note-
taking assistance

Give the student instruction
designed on improvement of
gross and fine motor skills

Ensure that class materials are
available to the student in
electronic format

Allow the student to have
adequate transportation time
between classes

Increase size of wheels, dials,
handles, and buttons on lab
equipment if needed

Lower the chalkboard, whiteboard,
or screen for information to be
seen by all students

Common Accommodations for Physical/Orthopedic Impairment Cont.

Assistive technology/augmentative communication devices for the student during the school day

Give the student frequent and timed breaks if they become tired easy

Provide the student with special seating arrangements or larger tables

Ensure that the classroom has wide aisles and is ADA compliant

Break large amounts of texts into smaller sections for the student

Arrange for library personnel to assist in access to card catalogs, bookshelves, and other equipment
