

PerformCare IDD Services:

Services through PerformCare for people with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.

Clinical and Therapeutic Interventions

These interventions are rehabilitative, focused on the restoration of a youth's functional level after an acute episode of decline in functioning related to mental illness or a significant life stressor. These include in-home therapy, specialized behavioral supports, and community-based rehabilitation to youth up to age 21.

Behavioral Interventions

These interventions are habilitative and designed for decreasing dangerous behaviors while assisting youth in acquiring and retaining self-help, communication, and adaptive skills. Services focus on helping youth learn these skills while working with and training the youth's parent or caregiver to implement the behavioral plan. Common interventions include Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) and Mobile Response for immediate crises.

Individual Support Services (ISS)

ISS is skill development for activities of daily living, including self-care tasks and the enabling of an individual to live independently in the community.

Services include in-home behavioral supports, adaptive skill training, community integration services, and Mobile Response Stabilization Services (MRSS).

Respite

Respite is intended to provide temporary relief for the primary caregiver from the demands of caring for an individual during the times when the caregiver would normally be available to provide care. The service relieves family members from care on a temporary basis for short periods of time. There are several different settings for respite including: home-based, agency after-school, overnight stays, and weekend recreation.

Assistive Technology

Assistive technology is designed to increase the functional skills of a youth with a developmental disability, and enhance their ability to live successfully in the community. An assistive device is an item to increase, maintain, or improve functional capabilities of the youth, and is not solely therapeutic. Services provide equipment and product systems that maintain, increase, or improve the functional capabilities.

Educational Advocacy

Education advocacy is a service provided to youth and their families when the youth needs in-depth help with education-related needs. Services include helping parents and legal guardians understand their rights, navigate school systems, and secure appropriate accommodations for children up to 21.
