Sibshops provide brothers and sisters of children with intellectual and developmental disabilities opportunities to share and connect with peers who "get it." Attending a Sibshop allows siblings a chance to meet one another in a relaxed setting. Children will have the opportunity to participate in fun activities such as "Dear Aunt Blabby," and group discussions designed to help children express the joys and concerns of being a sibling of a child with special needs. Sibshops acknowledge that brothers and sisters of people with special needs, like their

parents, may need support.

Overview of Services for Children and Young Adults with I/DD from the NJ Department of Children and Families, Children's System of Care

Wednesday, May 15, at 6 pm

Starting in 2013, the Children's System of Care (CSOC) within the NJ Department of Children and Families took over the provision of services to children and young adults with I/DD and their families. They provide many supports and services including family support, crisis intervention, after school programs, summer camp and intensive in-home and out-of-home supports, just to name a few.



Join us on May 15th to hear more about the services CSOC offers, eligibility for services, and how young adults transition from CSOC to adult services when they turn 21. Presenter: Rosemary Browne, MSW, Assistant Division Director of the Children's System of Care, NJ Department of Children and Families.

Webinar: Working with Adult Sexual Assault Survivors with I/DD Thursday, May 16, at 2 pm

The Program Director of the Disability Service Program at service provider agency SAFE Alliance in Austin Texas Michelle Schwartz serves survivors of child abuse, sexual assault and domestic violence. She has created a coordinated community response to violence against people with disabilities and provides a wide range of direct services to youth and adults with disabilities. This one hour overview is the first of a two-part series and is a great opportunity to hear how one program has effectively served an often overlooked population.

Transition Conference: Free Parent Forum & Opportunity Expo (Lawrenceville, NJ) Saturday, May 18, at 9 am

This expo will start with an opening session on why planning is critical and how to start a plan for your child with I/DD. The second session will explain SSI and Medicaid and why you need to apply. Attendees will then have a break to visit with our service providers who will have information tables set up. For the last session of the day, participants can choose one of three workshops focusing on different areas of interest.

Webinar: Supporting People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities in Healthy Relationships

Tuesday, May 21, at 12 pm

All people, including those with intellectual and developmental disabilities, want happy and healthy relationships. Join us as Michael Pearson Jr., Training and Technical Assistance Coordinator for the New Jersey Self-Advocacy Project, discusses different types of relationships, and how to support a loved one look for and stay in a healthy relationship. The webinar will also focus on online dating and safety, establishing boundaries and teaching consent.
